


The Thor Heyerdahl International Day (THI Day)

The Thor Heyerdahl International Day series on the topic of MIGRATION has been organized for the last 3 years in cooperation between The Vestfold Museums by The Thor Heyerdahl Institute, Augsburg University, USA and Vestfold and Telemark County Council.

This year's International Day will conclude our series where we have emphasized three different components to migration.
They are:

In 2021, we highlighted MIGRATION AND IDENTITY

In 2022, we highlighted MIGRATION AND ETHNICITY

This year, in 2023, we will focus on MIGRATION AND CLIMATE CHANGE.

Mass migration is caused by CLIMATE change. According to the UN Refugee Agency, the impacts of climate change already cause an average of more than 20 million people worldwide to leave their homes and move to other areas each year.

This kind of migration occurs when people leave their homes due to extreme weather events including floods, heat waves, droughts, and wildfires, as well as slower-moving climate challenges such as rising seas and intensifying water stress.

All three years, we have cooperated with Vest-Agder Museum's EU-project, Identity on the Line, with partners from 7 European countries, a large-scale research project based on interviews with three generations of families. This project aimed to explore how they had coped with migration and how this had an impact on their development.

Inspired by UNESCO World Science Day for Peace and Development

Thor Heyerdahl was a Norwegian explorer (1914-2002) born in Larvik, Norway. He rose to international fame because of his success with many brave expeditions, in collaboration with international teams. Thor Heyerdahl's archives were included in UNESCO's World Heritage list from 2011.

Key areas of focus are Thor Heyerdahl's global efforts to protect and conserve the environment, his understanding for and ability to engage in dialogue between people from different cultures, his dissemination of information about global challenges, and his strong will to challenge people to debate across established scientific boundaries.

He was a citizen of the world and lived in many places during his life, including 25 years in Colla Micheri, Andora, Italy.

The institute has collaborated with Larvik and Andora since 2015 with the aim of establishing a partnership between the two municipalities. A formal town twinning agreement between Larvik and Andora was signed in 2018.

The city of Andora is located in the region of Liguria, the province of Savona in northwestern Italy, 75 km from the border with France.

He participated in the European Union project "Mediterranean changing relationships: global change, networks and border openings" as coordinator of the work package "Uneven impact of climate change on migration flows, tourism, rural development and socio-economic stability in the Mediterranean countries". He is the author of more than one hundred publications appearing in Italian and scientific magazines and some monographs.

Americanist anthropologist, Assistant Professor of Ethnology at the University of Genoa since 1973. Then Associate Professor from 1989. Since 2005, a full Professor of Ethnology at the Faculty of Foreign Languages at the University of Genoa and later at the Faculty of Political Sciences. Professor in two Doctorates (Turin and Genoa), national and international reviewer, author of more than 100 publications, is specialized in Americanist anthropology, especially in the areas of Brazil and the Caribbean. Translator from Brazilian and French to Italian, consultant for Museums and Institutions, coordinator of many research projects, from 2006 to 2012 she was President of the Associazione Nazionale Universitaria degli Antropologi Culturali (ANUAC) and from 2012 to 2014 she was the creator and Scientific Director of the international ethnoanthropological journal ANUAC. Coordinator of book collections, she is currently President of Jacarandá, an Interdisciplinary Association of Italian Brasilianists.

In 2022, the European Museum Academy Award was given to the European project "I-ON: Identity on the Line", led by Vest Agder Museum.

2023 International Film Award to the "I-ON: Identity on the Line" project

Even after Identity on the Line has officially ended, the project continues to reap awards and international recognition: This time the Heritage Audiovisuals Special Commendation 2023 award for a 45-minute documentary about the project and its sub-projects!

The documentary "Identity on the Line" is an outstanding study of the effects of a relevant historical process that is still part of the political and social agenda: human migration. The topic is relevant for the European identity and sense of belonging that the documentary deeply explains. This special mention is a recognition for its humanistic approach to migration that helps contemporary citizens to reflect on the issue.

The Thor Heyerdahl Scholarship 2023 Winners MIGRATION & CLIMATE CHANGE

The background for the Thor Heyerdahl Scholarship was a gift from the Norwegian Government to the institute on the occasion of Thor Heyerdahl's 100th anniversary in 2014. Since 2016, the institute has announced a competitive annual Thor Heyerdahl Scholarship of EURO 5 000. The scholarship is aimed at the age group from 16-19 and is open to all high school students in Norway. Its objective is to stimulate young people to continue to develop the cultural legacy of Thor Heyerdahl.



The Museum Luciano Dabroi in Palazzo Tagliaferro has hosted art exhibitions and cultural events over the years and on this occasion, three exhibitions will be opened about Migration & Climate Change.

In 2019, a Thor Heyerdahl exhibition was established at the Luciano Dabroi Mineralogical Museum of Palazzo Tagliaferro in Andora. Andora and Larvik have been twin towns since 2018. The exhibition was a collaborative project between the Italian Embassy in Oslo, the Kon-Tiki Museum, the University of Milan, the University of Genoa, the municipalities of Larvik and Andora, and The Thor Heyerdahl Institute.

In 2023, new exhibitions have been included in the former Thor Heyerdahl exhibition. It is a collaborative project between the Kon-Tiki Museum, the foundation of Saga Oseberg, The Vest-Agder Museum with the EU-project "Identity on the Line" and The Thor Heyerdahl Institute with the Thor Heyerdahl scholarship winners of 2022 and 2023.
